Henry Dean served the City of New Orleans as a member of the Police Department from February 1978 to August of 2015. He retired at the rank of Captain after having served over 38 years. After his retirement from the City of New Orleans, Henry Dean worked in hotel security for one year and then joined the staff at Delgado Community College on November 28, 2016 as Assistant Director of Security for the Delgado Campus Police Department and maintains that position today.

Henry Dean served as a trustee of the Louisiana Municipal Police Employees Retirement System Board for 16 years and he chaired that Board for seven years. Henry Dean also served as President of the Local Lodge of the Fraternal Order of Police – Crescent City Lodge #2, which represented almost 2,000 active and retired members of the New Orleans Police Department and other local agencies.

In his capacity as a Police Officer, trustee, chairman and president, Henry Dean always acted in the best interest of the individuals and the institutions that he represented. He has appeared before State Legislative bodies to argue on behalf of his membership and community, relative to matters that impacted lives and livelihood.
