After he retired from the City of New Orleans, Henry Dean joined the staff at Delgado Community College on November 28, 2016, as Assistant Director of Security for the Delgado Campus Police Department and maintains that position today. Henry Dean served as a trustee of the multi-million-dollar Louisiana Municipal Police Employees Retirement System Board for 16 years and chaired that Board for seven years. Henry Dean also served as President of the Local Lodge of the Fraternal Order of Police – Crescent City Lodge #2, representing 2,000 active and retired members of the New Orleans Police Department and other local agencies. The Fraternal Order of Police is a 501 (c)(3) organization. Henry Dean supported this organization's effort to move their monthly meetings to the Deutsches Haus. Henry Dean is still active in this organization and continues to support efforts that benefit active and retired Police Officers.

For five years, Henry Dean and his wife, Janice, have made the Deutsches Haus a significant part of their lives by participating in Haus functions as volunteers and patrons. Henry Dean has volunteered at several Oktoberfests, Christmaskindlmarkts, the first Nutcracker Brunch, Volksfests, Trivia nights, and Jazz Fest parking.
